Answer: Yes, the Company expects to have negative operating cash flows for the time being as production and exploration activities at the Papua New Guinea (PNG) project remains suspended, and due to ongoing exploration activities at the Australian projects. As such, the Company does not generate income.

8.8.2 Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

Answer: The Company announced on 10 March 2023 that it was proposing to undertake a capital raising, which includes a Placement of \$8M and an Entitlement Offer to raise combined up to \$14.9M, before costs. The Company anticipates the capital raising to be competed in Q2 2023. The Company continues to have the support of its major shareholder, Freefire Technology Limited, if required to meet its obligations.

Answer: Yes, the Company does expect to be able to continue its operations and meet its business objectives based on the continued support of Freefire and the success of other options with regards to raising additional funds as discussed above in 8.8.2.
